## WAYS TO KEEP THE FLORAL BUDGET IN CHECK

#### 1. SET A CLEAR FLORAL BUDGET

Start with a dollar figure. Most couples spend 8–15% of their wedding budget on florals, but you can allocate less if you're strategic.

#### 2. PRIORITISE KEY ARRANGEMENTS

Focus on "wow-factor" florals:

- Bridal bouquet
- Ceremony backdrop
- One reception statement piece (e.g. a hanging installation or head table arrangement)
- Then scale back on less impactful items.

#### 3. REPURPOSE CEREMONY FLOWERS

Use ceremony arbours, aisle arrangements, or plinths again at your reception (e.g. behind the sweetheart table or on the dancefloor entrance).

#### 4. CHOOSE IN-SEASON & LOCAL BLOOMS

In-season flowers are more affordable and fresher. Ask your florist what's abundant locally in your wedding month.

#### 5. GO BIG ON FOLIAGE

Greenery like gum leaves, olive branches, and tropical palms are costeffective fillers and create lush volume.

#### 6. SELECT STATEMENT FLOWERS WITH BIG IMPACT

Blooms like hydrangeas, chrysanthemums, or king proteas cover more space with fewer stems — fewer flowers, same visual punch.

#### 7. LIMIT VARIETY

Reducing the number of flower types makes it easier for your florist to buy in bulk, cutting costs.

#### 8. OPT FOR SMALLER BOUQUETS

Instead of oversized bouquets, go for minimalist or modest posies especially for bridesmaids.

#### 9. SIMPLIFY TABLE CENTREPIECES

Choose low-cost styling for tables:

- Single stems in bud vases
- Grouped clusters instead of full centrepieces
- Candles mixed with simple florals
- 10. Mix Fresh with Dried Dried or preserved flowers can reduce the number of fresh stems needed and you can keep them forever.
